UNIQUE UWTSD FACTS

Campuses Across The UK

UWTSD has campuses in Birmingham, Cardiff, Carmarthen, London, and Swansea.

Largest Subject Area

Business & Management is the largest subject area at UWTSD, with 6,050 FPE (Full Person Equivalent) in 2023/24.

Mature Student Majority

UWTSD's student body is considerably older than sector averages. **86% of female students** at UWTSD are mature, significantly higher than Wales (68%) and UK (63%). And **80% of male students** at UWTSD are mature, again higher than Wales (64%) and UK (62%).

Postgrad Taught Programmes

Education and Teaching has one of the highest proportions of students enrolled in Postgraduate Taught programmes at UWTSD.

Students With Disabilities

UWTSD reported a notably higher disability rate (18.4%) than Wales (10.8%) and UK (11.2%). With the proportion of students declaring two or more conditions standing at 23% – notably higher than the Wales (18%) and UK (19%) benchmarks.

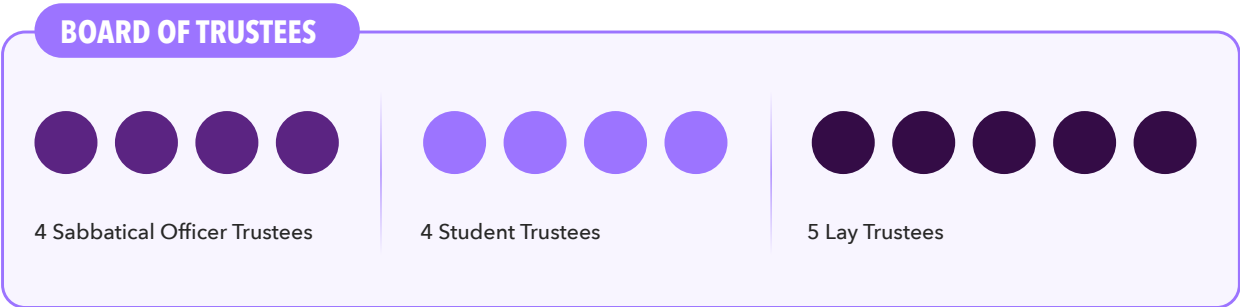

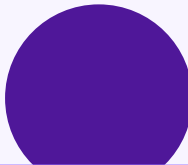

Our Sub-Committees

The Board also has three sub-committees, each with its own remit delegated from the Board of Trustees. These committees report back to the Board on their activity. All sub-committees are support by the Governance and Administration Manager, acting as the sectary.

Health & Safety Sub-Committee

Health & Safety is important in all organisations, this sub-committee develops, maintains, and assesses the SU's Health & Safety policies and standards. It ensures that the union is abiding by relevant legislation. Furthermore, it makes sure there is clear reporting between the university and students' union in relation to Health & Safety.

The committee is made up of one sabbatical officer, one Lay trustee and one student trustee. A representative from UWTSD Health & safety department, the Chief Executive and Head of Business and Finance are ex-officio members.

People & Culture Sub-Committee

Responsible for monitoring and reviewing: recruitment and selection, pay and conditions of employment, staff relations, and staff development.

Three External Trustees (1 in the Chair - BOT Vice-Chair), one Student Trustee and an external appointee make up the full members of the committee. The Chief Executive and Head of Business & Finance as ex officio members.

Finance, Audit & Risk Sub-Committee

The budget for the union is taken to this sub-committee before it is presented to the Board of Trustees. The sub-committee also reviews the expenditure and income of the union throughout the year. During the review of the year, it may be that the sub-committee recommends any amendments to the budget. The committee also ensures that all of the appropriate statutory and regulatory financial reporting is undertaken.

The committee is made up of three Sabbatical Trustees; one Student Trustee; one Lay Trustee as full members, a representative from UWTSD finance department. The Chief Executive and Head of Business & Finance as ex officio members.

The union needs to be externally audited to ensure that this audit and actions are followed up by the Finance, Audit & Risk Sub-Committee exists. It also monitors internal controls and risk management systems.

Our Opportunities team focuses on the fun side of student life. Encouraging students to explore their passions and interests with our clubs and societies, or live it up alongside their fellow students at our events, have awesome experiences with Give It A Go, and develop their skills and knowledge with Skills Week.

Our Advice team is there whenever students need a helping hand. They treat our members as equals: there to listen, not to judge, and to give our students free, independent, and confidential advice around issues in the classroom and beyond.

STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES

Bringing the fun is our Opportunities team. To help our members make the most of their student experience we run lots of different activities tailored to each of our campuses.

STUDENT VOICE

Students are a force for good - their thoughts, actions, and passion shape how things get done

We are proudly student-led. Through our democratic structure, students having a direct say in our leadership, and their opinions shape what we do and how we do it.

It's our mission to make sure that their thoughts and ideas of our members get heard by those who need to hear them - both at the university and beyond - and we have a network of representatives and officers to help us do this.

What do we offer?

- Students can nominate and vote in our Student Elections, and can become a President, Part-time Officer, Student Trustee, or Union Chairperson.
- Our members can find out what we've been up and vote on our policies at our Annual General Meeting, alongside our campus councils and union councils that we run across the academic year.
- Students can join our network of course reps and student voice reps to help gather grass-roots feedback.
- They can share their ideas on our Big Ideas platform where students can give their opinions on a proposal.



In 2024/25 we achieved our highest voter turnout in our election history, and changed our democratic structure with new student officer positions

Students voted to change our democratic structure at our Annual General Meeting in 2024/25 - replacing our existing officer and presidents structure with a new one made up of 4 new president and 25 new part-time officers.

In spring 2025, more students than ever before had a direct say in the people representing them, with our highest-ever voter turn for a student election.

STUDENT ADVICE

Our members can come to us for free, independent, and confidential advice whenever they need it

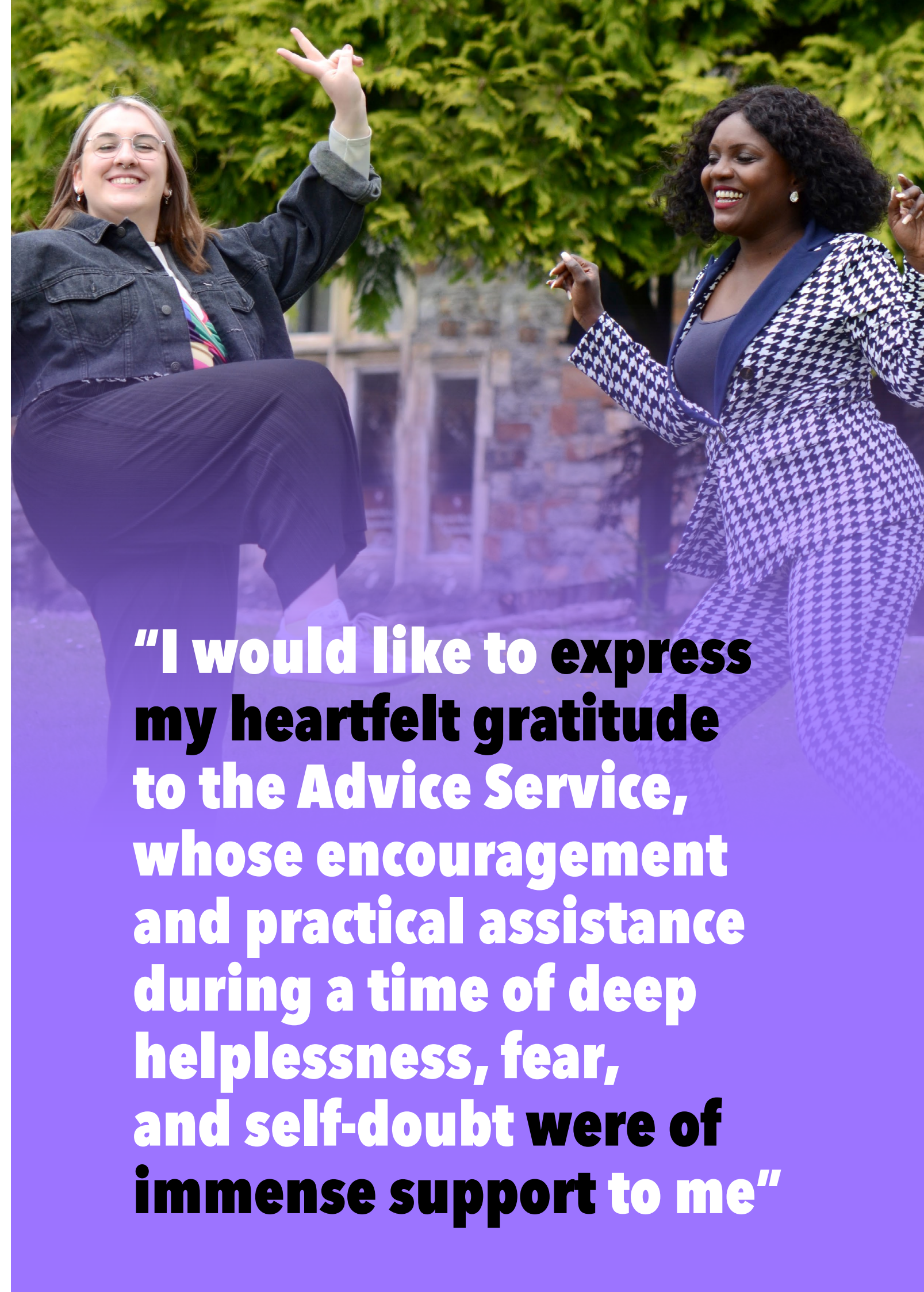
We aim to empower our members to make the decisions that are right for them, by helping them access the right support and giving guidance on processes.

Our advice service is free, independent, and confidential. It specialises in providing academic advice, but also helps student access broader support within the university and beyond.

In 2024/25, 952 cases and enquires were opened with our advice service (That's an 8.8% increase compared to 2023/24). They supported 40 cases whereby a favourable decision was made, and our early intervention meant that 15 cases were successful at the 'informal' stage. And through advocacy, bursaries, and casework, students secured £55,990 in financial funds.

STUDENT VENUES

We run a student social space, bar, and club on our Carmarthen campus

Y Llofft is Carmarthen's on-campus student social space and bar located on the first floor of the Students' Union building, and Y Clwb is Carmarthen's on-campus club, located on the ground floor of the Students' Union Building.

The Y Llofft Social Space is the place for students to go outside of lectures to meet up with friends, chill out, play a few games, and study somewhere with a more relaxed vibe.

Inside Y Llofft you'll find a Smart TV, a free-to-use pool table and ping pong table, a Sony PlayStation 5, a Nintendo Wii - both have a solid game selection - and plenty of board games, books, and films.

The Y Llofft Student Bar is there to keep students entertained and serves up drinks and refreshments on a student-friendly budget. It's open on select week nights and run events from time-to-time.

Y Clwb is a big venue bringing you club vibes, with powerful speakers to get things bouncing. What type of events do we run? Think live music gigs, freshers balls, summer balls, silent discos. Y Clwb is open exclusively for planned events.
