Project: Greener Campus

Lampeter Campus President manifesto focuses on increasing sustainability and greener spaces across the campus (including the creation of living walls), this role is to support the development of an even greener campus.

To deliver this role the intern will work with the Local Nature Partnership who bring together local organisations, businesses and people who want to improve their local natural environment. The role will help create activities like: wellbeing walks, gardening, allotments/community gardens with a focus on term time seasonal growth.

To further enhance engagement and promotion the post will support the development of an app/interactive web pages to celebrate what has been done and a call to action to continue to enhance greener spaces on Lampeter campus. The post will celebrate the rewilding spaces and undertake audits of flora and fauna.

This post will also support the University Sustainability team, the Students' Union, and INSPIRE in the creation of a business case and find local sponsorship for a living wall on Lampeter campus. Additionally, the role will campaign to encourage student volunteers to look after the proposed green wall and create improvement plan looking at diversity of planting.

Meetings will be held on a regular basis to monitor progress with both the member of the INSPIRE team, the Sustainability team, and the Provost. The Intern will also be expected to work independently and complete monthly reports for the attention of their line manager.
