





What did you think of the tour overall?



- Post-tour in December the students' union asked everyone who attended to complete a short survey. The overall result of the survey was an average of 4.25 out of 5.

Feedback from students - Learning Resources

*"Definitely **more assured** with the move and with the knowledge that most of the campus is easily accessible and the accommodation is about the same quality as Lampeter"*

*"**I'm most concerned about the library being able to fit our books**, not just ones on our reading list and module but just the ones we currently have access to and would like continued access to, especially going into our dissertation year"*

*"It feels manageable **but the library is a major concern**. There seemed to be no concrete plan on how the books that we as humanities student needs will be vetted."*

*"There is **NOT enough space to move the Lampeter library resources** to without extending the Carmarthen building..."*

Last year there was a +3.8% increase in Learning Resources within the NSS for a score of 86.3%. As an SU we want to support LLR in continuing to increase that score. The SU would like to continue to work in partnership with the University on resolving the concerns of students in relation to resources for present anxieties of students and for the future NSS score.

Supporting the transition of students

- On Wednesday 15 January the students' union undertook focus groups with all performing industries students based on Carmarthen campus. This was supported directly by the Academic Director and colleagues from the discipline. One of the prevailing comments was around **connecting with each other and those on other programmes in a structured way.**



- To aid the transitional piece for both Lampeter and Carmarthen students it is proposed there is a modest transitional fund provided to the students' union.
- Said fund would be focused on activity in the first semester (September 25 - December 25). A full plan can be provided to PSLT and created in collaboration with Operations. It is suggested that events in the local area, on campus, and in halls of residence would be our starting point for integration.

What is the ask from the SU

- 1) That the University include answers to the concerns relating to learning resources which students have raised with the University and SU (Archaeology Labs and Library relocation) when communicating its announcement of any decision.
- 2) That there is the opportunity for the students' union and UWTSD Operations team to submit a business case for a modest transition fund (exact figures for discussion) for Sept 25 - Dec 25.
- 3) If the decision is made to move programmes: that there is a mechanism of assurance that appropriate bodies are notified and updated to support students who wish to transfer to another institution (this would be part of business as usual and is simply a continuation of positive comms and support required per student agreement)
